Our community is filled with the potential of God's. Some highlights from the last year demonstrate the graces of God at work in our parish:

- ◆ Entered into a Parish
 Covenant committing
 ourselves to honor and build
 upon the bridges of Worship,
 Connection, Service and
 Growth.
- ♦ Installed new elevator doors to protect fingers and keep the elevator in good shape for all who use it.
- ♦ Cleaned 100 years of paint off the wood panels above the main doors and sealed and preserved all exposed wood
- With the help of many parish volunteers we gave the rectory landscaping a much needed face lift, and enhanced the beauty of our campus.
- ◆ Continue to serve breakfast each month to our neighborhood. Serving up to 225 people with the generous support of workers and many donors.
- ◆ Paid 100% of the education assessment for the support of Saginaw Area Catholic Schools, and with the help of Bishop Cistone we have eliminated \$201,000 in overdue payments.
- ♦ Fully implemented Diocesan Financial Practices and have a balance sheet and reporting method which allows the finance council, parish, and diocese to gage the financial health of the parish.

1.Honor your decision to be part of our community by attending Mass here a majority of the time. While we have seen new registrations, we have not had a corresponding increase in Sunday attendance. 2. Give to God as He has given to you. If we all give of our time, talent and treasure in an effort to return to God a portion of what has been given to us, we will discover there is more than enough.


The Lord can take our gifts and multiply them, a small increase in giving from each of us can have a dramatic impact.
